#### **REFLECTION**

Artificial Intelligence?

We regularly drive to visit my mother-in-law who lives in South East Kent. The drive is now familiar, but I usually put the satnav on just in case there are traffic issues, apparently the satnav tells us about these issues though the consequences of following proposed alternative routes can be surprising. However, the reason for mentioning a car which is over ten years old (we were recently fined for straying unknowingly into the congestion zone in Bristol) is that it contains some interesting artificial intelligence. For example, the satnav somehow "knows" our usual route so that it helpfully directs us to a supermarket in Farnham where we can buy a sandwich, a bag of crisps and a coffee. We didn't tell the satnav to do it. It just does it. However, before I get carried away with praise there are also some shocking features. When attempting to overtake a cyclist, I have experienced shaking of the steering wheel to steer to the left because the car thought I might collide with an oncoming vehicle while not "seeing" the cyclist.

Why am I writing this? Artificial Intelligence (AI) has been part of our lives for a very long time. People were developing programs that aimed to simulate human conversations when I was a student which was a very long time ago. However, now the software has become more sophisticated and subtle. I can now talk to the television to get the film I want, and 14 years ago I had an operation which involved a "robot" controlled by a surgeon, there was no need to open me up completely!

Computers can be used to make sense of huge amounts of information ("big data") to come to conclusions for example about what the money markets are doing, and to analyse the opinions of potential voters in upcoming elections. The data used are unstructured, but the computer can create structure and rules from what it learns of the data and suggest, for example, different taxes that will appeal to potential voters.

It seems clear to me that if the big data are extracted from say the Daily Mail it would produce different rules and results than if it was extracted from the Socialist Worker. So where should we get our data from to manage our artificial intelligence?

In my daily readings of the Bible, I have just read a lesser-known book, the letter of Jude. It is very short but there is a sentence that strikes me in the context of AI: "For certain persons have crept in unnoticed, those who were long beforehand marked out for this condemnation, ungodly persons who turn the grace of God into licentiousness..."

That was a risk in Jude's time, and it is a risk now. When we use AI that is driven by big data where does the data come from?

As a Christian I believe that a place to start when analysing data is the Bible.

The verse I quoted from Jude goes on to say those persons who corrupt "...deny our only master and Lord, Jesus Christ".

More than ever we need a pole star, a clear fixed ethical framework that is independent of our personal ideas and preferences and which will offer guidance in how artificial intelligence is allowed to shape the future.

I believe that the person of Christ and his teaching are alive and can offer that guidance to all, even in all these complexities, if we take time to get to know His meaning and to follow Him.

#### SOMERSET COUNCILLOR UPDATE

Dear The Link reader



The main news is that on 20<sup>th</sup> February, Somerset Council's Full Council passed a budget and set the Council Tax for 2024/25, avoiding a Section 114 Notice. The budget was approved by 52 votes (all Lib Dem) to 9 against and with 31 abstentions. I voted for the budget to avoid a s114 because it was the only responsible thing to do. If we did not pass a balanced budget, the Council's Chief Finance Officer would have had no choice but to submit a Section 114 Notice to the Government under the Local Government Finance Act, effectively declaring bankruptcy, as some other councils have recently. To avoid this was some achievement.

Months ago, massive increases in the costs of social care (for elderly and disabled adults, and children) (partly due to the Government's aborted Fair Cost of Care initiative), higher inflation and interest rates, Government underfunding of the new council, previous County council tax freezes, a low Council Tax and tax base, and the disruption of reorganising 5 councils into one meant that Somerset Council had a £100 million budget gap for 2024-25. If this was not closed, the Chief Finance Officer would submit a Section 114 Notice, meaning all but absolutely essential spending stops, expensive Government commissioners come in to cut services and increase council tax with no democratic control. But Somerset Council's Lib Dem run administration has worked to avoid this, by consulting the community on your priorities, working to identify sufficient savings, going through the cross-party scrutiny process with councillors, asking Government for a capitalisation direction (which requires the sale of council assets and commercial investments), using reserves, and working with town/city/parish councils to devolve local services.

Many of the original savings proposals have been either withdrawn or changed to allow alternative funding models to be explored. These include savings linked to highways maintenance, RNLI lifeguard provision, school crossing patrols, and savings linked to democratic functions such as Scrutiny. Some services will now be protected by working in partnership with City, Town and Parish Councils, including Somerset's CCTV service and public toilets, and discussions continue to make this happen.

However, some services will be lost, and many staff will be made redundant in a necessary 'transformation', as set out in a detailed list of 162 savings proposals. A budget for 2025/26 also looks extremely challenging, as you can only sell assets once. It is not just Somerset – in a recent report the Levelling Up, Housing and Communities Committee pointed to systemic underfunding of local

councils in England and called on the Government to fix a £4 billion hole in council funding now or risk severe impacts to council services and further councils facing effective bankruptcy. It called on the next Government to create a sustainable funding system for local authorities (as this one will not). Our MP Sarah Dyke has also been raising the issue effectively in parliament. The next general election will be your chance to elect a new Government that takes our vital public services, and local government, seriously.

Somerset Council's portion of Council Tax is again to increase by £82.14 a year (4.99%). Your parish councils have made small increases to their precepts, including to contribute more to local services. Here in Frome North the parish precepts are increasing by the following amounts a year for a Band D property in 2024/25 (and % from 2023/24): Frome: £56.90 (26%), Beckington £7.60 (9.95%), Berkley £8.00 (31%), Norton St Philip £1.31 (1%), Rode £9.63 (19.6%), Lullington: no increase, Tellisford: no precept.

If you pay Council Tax but have a low income, you could be eligible for Council Tax Reduction – see https://www.somerset.gov.uk/benefits-and-payments/council-tax-reduction/.

#### **Planning New Housing**

Somerset Council's Planning and Transportation Subcommittee met recently and considered a report on the proposed development site allocations to update the Mendip Local Plan (which has had a 505 dwelling shaped hole in it since Norton St Philip Parish Council's successful judicial review in 2022). None of the sites put forward by landowners/developers in Rode, Beckington or Norton St Philip have been proposed by the Council's planning policy team for inclusion for various reasons, and replacement allocations have been proposed in Frome, Glastonbury, Street, Wells, Coleford, and around Midsomer Norton/Westfield instead. I understand that a public consultation on a draft site allocations document will follow shortly. Work on a Somerset-wide Local Plan also begins later in 2024-25.

#### Rode Roads

Speed limits in and around Rode are also going to change, after a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) was issued in January for a public consultation. Rode village will have a new 20mph limit, and main roads around it (including the A361, Rode Hill and Bradford Road) will have lower speeds with extended 30mph and 40mph limits. The changes were requested by Rode Parish Council several years ago. I understand there has been no objections, so the new speed limits should be implemented by Somerset Council some time after April. There have been several serious accidents on higher speed roads in the area last year.

The new locally-set speed limits are an indication of the community's desire for safer roads, so I hope these will be respected, for everyone's safety.

#### ST LAWRENCE ROOF APPEAL UPDATE

Our latest fund raiser for the church roof will be held in the Memorial Hall on the 2<sup>nd</sup> March – our 'Who Killed the Golf Pro' murder mystery evening. Please come along for what is a fun evening and to help raise money for the church.

ThaThis past month has seen many large rallies across Somerset campaigning against threatened bus cuts. These rallies have received wide coverage on both BBC and ITV local news, BBC Radio Somerset and in the local press.



Bus protests have taken place across Somerset this month.

Unfortunately, bus passenger numbers still have not yet fully recovered to the pre Covid levels although a marked increase in patronage has been seen since the Government's introduction of the £2 single fare a year ago.

Given the financial emergency declared by Somerset Council, Somerset Council is not able to increase its funding of bus routes.

The best way to save our buses isn't by holding protests but by more people to go more often by bus.

First Bus has warned that the incremental cost of their D2 Frome to Bath service coming through Rode is not currently being covered by the fare income they are getting by coming via Rode.

Whilst our Rode bus service is safe when the bus timetable changes this April, First Bus say they will be reviewing how much improved patronage they get in Rode over the next few months and that will determine whether they can continue to come through Rode from September 2024. First say they will need to see extra business both through the week, however it is particularly at weekends where First need to see a significant increase in the numbers of Rode folk using the D2.

So we have the next 6 months to SAVE OUR BUSES in Rode.

So, please BUS IT whenever you can.

Rode Parish Council will publish and door drop a new Rode bus timetable to every home in Rode in early April..

Cast your minds back to the end of summer last year and Laverton's William Sargent's fabulous floral fundraising efforts for Wiltshire Air Ambulance...all of which raised an amazing £566!

Earlier this month William and his friends were invited to the air base at Semington to hand over the funds he raised, enjoy a full VIP tour and learn all about this vital service.





They learned that it takes on average 3 minutes from receiving the 999 call to take off and they can reach the middle of Bath in under 4 minutes flying time, Rode, Laverton or Norton, in under 3 minutes. They can also fly patients to whatever hospital is most appropriate, including to Oxford.

On board is a pilot and either a doctor or a paramedic and they're often requested when the location of patients are inaccessible to land ambulances, particularly in rural areas. If they can't find a suitable landing site nearby, they have to carry all their equipment with them, sometimes walking long distances. The children struggled to lift just one of the bags they would need to carry!

They gave a really important tip: What3Words is very helpful information to pass on, so they know the exact location and they can then source a landing site before arrival. Links to What3 Words below.

They average 3 call outs every day and it costs over £12,000 a day to operate. The annual cost is £4.5 million. William said that's a lot of flowers! ## Parish Environment CLIMATE EMERGENCY UPDATE

#### **Proposed Solar Farm**

As noted in the February edition of The Link, the planning application for a large-scale solar farm in Rode was due to be determined by 12<sup>th</sup> February. However, the applicant has been required to provide a significant amount of additional information in order to respond to issues raised by consultees. Most of this additional information is now available on the Somerset Council website: https://www.somerset.gov.uk/planning-buildings-and-land/view-and-comment-on-a-planning-application/ [On the SC website, go to "Planning, buildings and land", then select "View or comment on a planning application", choose "Mendip", then go to "Find an application". The application reference is 2023/2183/FUL].

In particular, the applicant disagrees with the views put forward by Historic England, the Somerset Council Conservation Officer, and the Mendip Conservation Officer. The applicant appears to have made some minor changes to the extent of the development (with some of the solar panels in close proximity to Flexham Farm removed), but otherwise – from the documents currently available – the extent of the proposed solar farm is unchanged.

Rode Parish Council has been informed that the determination date of this application has been extended and the application will probably be considered at the April meeting of the Somerset East Planning Committee (2<sup>nd</sup> April). It is likely that Somerset Council will issue a new 14 day re-consultation period (although this will depend on the scope of changes proposed).

Representatives from Low Carbon, the developer of the proposed scheme, have been invited to present an update on their plans to the Parish Council, and that meeting will take place on 11<sup>th</sup> March.

### Rode Repair Café

Plans are underway to bring a Repair Café to Rode! Building on the success of the Norton St Philip Repair Café, the idea is to hold at least a couple of events a year in Rode, with the first one pencilled-in for **Saturday 8th June** (in Rode Memorial Hall). In order for this event to take place we obviously need expert repairers! 

#### **RODE & DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB**

Our February meeting was entertaining and informative as our engaging speaker, Derek Dexter, shared his passion for fuchsias. He brought .with him a wide selection of strong rooted cuttings and very useful advice on how to grow fuchsias successfully. It is not his job but something he does in his spare time. He's been growing/showing successfully for many years, often beating fuchsia growing



specialists. Until Covid he was living in Woking, where his local society entered the RHS Hampton Court Show in the 'Window Box & Hanging Baskets Class', winning a silver-gilt medal in 2007. He moved to Somerset in 2021.

Fuchsias came from Central and South America originally. Hardy varieties will grow outside successfully provided they are planted in the ground. Those grown in pots and tender varieties need to be protected from frost. In late October Derek trims his plants right back and strips all leaves off. They are kept barely damp in a greenhouse where the temperature remains above 6 degrees. In early January they are encouraged back into growth, but most gardeners should do this in late February or early March. Every plant is checked over for vine weevils and the roots reduced by sawing off the bottom third and repotting in fresh compost. The plants are sprayed with water daily to moisten the woody stems so new growth breaks out all the way up the stem, not just at the top.

Once the plant is in leaf cuttings can be taken. These are very small; multiple cuttings of just 2 pairs of leaves on a short stem stuck into a 2-inch pot of sieved compost. Labelled and placed on a warm windowsill they'll root successfully in 18-21 days, rooted cuttings go into modules to grow on for 8 weeks, feed every 2 weeks. All plants are pinched out above every third pair of leaves, so plants become bushy with many points where flowers will come. Harden off from mid-May - early June, then can be planted out to enjoy all summer/autumn, continue feeding and each plant will be covered in flowers. Removing dead flower heads encourages more, but any berries which are black can be eaten or made into jam. Water when the pots feel lighter. If the pot's heavy, it doesn't need more - overwatering is harmful. Watch carefully for vine weevils/hawk moth caterpillars/fuchsia gall mite but these plants are easy to grow well.

## **Parish Gardening**

The birdsong is rising to a raucous crescendo and it can feel like the milder weather is telling us it's time to finally get spring cleaning in the garden after months of watching the garden steadily slide into a brown mush.

But tread carefully around the borders and stay the fingers itching to work those secateurs - or at least try to exercise a little restraint: we need to remember the risk of sudden freezes and sharp frosts stays with us for many more weeks to come.

But for the irrepressible amongst us, here are a few jobs we can safely tackle now:

- Rose pruning prioritise taking out dead, diseased and damaged stems; look
  at the overall framework, removing old woody stems if there's strong new
  growth at the base and try to cut just above an outward-facing bud loads of
  guidance available online...
- Bare root planting go for it! Time is running out! Think about any gaps in hedges that could be filled now, or indulge yourself and buy a new tree, or maybe a rose or two
- Get on with the wisteria winter prune a firm hand is required, be bold and fearless and take it back to a couple of buds on the main frame of stems
- Sow Sweet Peas hang on, where have you been, why haven't you done this already??
- Make the most of the final weeks of dark late afternoons of planning time spring is nearly here!





### **Parish Council Meeting Minutes**

## MINUTES OF MEETING OF RODE PARISH COUNCIL HELD IN RODE MEMORIAL HALL ON MONDAY 12th FEBRUARY 2024 AT 7.30 pm

#### UNCONFIRMED

#### **Present:**

Cllr Mike Salmon (MS) – Chair, Cllr Ann Edney (AE), Cllr Jonathan Bowler (JB), Cllr Pat Restorick (PR) and Cllr Moira Punt (MP).

**In attendance:** Hugh Williams – Clerk and Cllr Dawn Denton (County Councillor) and 2 Parishioners

- 1. Parishioners Participation: Concern was raised over the new windows that had been installed in The White House on Lower Street. These new windows had replaced the old rather ornate windows and had altered the look of the house in a Conservation Area. There were other buildings in Rode which had similar ornate windows and concern was expressed that these could be lost. It was noted that the building was not listed and no Article 4 was in place to prevent window replacement. Therefore, nothing could be done in this case as Somerset Council had been consulted. However, it was agreed the Parish Council would look into how Article 4 could be applied to buildings in the Rode Conservation Areas this would probably involve photographs and some history on properties and consultation with Somerset. Cllr Denton agreed to investigate the process.
- **2. Apologies for absence**: Cllr P Travis, Cllr J McAuliffe, Cllr A Pickett and Cllr A Boyden (County Councillor)
- **3. Approval of the minutes**: The minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 15<sup>th</sup> January were approved.
- **4. Declarations of interest:** None.

#### 5. Actions from previous meeting:

- **i** Grass cutting: Tony Jones and his son were attending the meeting to introduce themselves and said they were looking forward to cutting the grass within Rode. They emphasised that they would be keeping an eye on the length of the grass and would carry out cuts to keep it short, even if this involved more frequent cutting. The signed contract was returned.
- **ii.** Paths at playing field: Grant Slade had provided a new set of costings for a gate and path into the playing field. This would be a good quality temporary path that could, depending on the future of the village hall location etc., either be made permanent or removed. It was agreed by majority to proceed with this path once the ground had dried sufficiently.
- **iii. The Mill:** It was reported Cllr Pickett had written to the Licencing Officer at Somerset regarding the new Licence and was awaiting a response.

- **iv. Paths from Barrow Farm:** The Clerk reported a new reduced quote was expected for keeping the paths clear and this should meet the PC requirements.
- v. **Drainage:** It was reported that CALM had not finished all the drainage works and that when Somerset took over from Mendip they did not take over the agreed works. Cllr McAuliffe was in discussions with the Community Engagement Officer (Dr Paul Elliston) regarding drainage on Crooked Lane and Straight Lane. Suggestions that Rode develop a Community Emergency Plan to cover flooding had been made. MP said that the Climate Group could look at this. The Chair reported that the LCN had also considered producing flood resistance plans for Parishes. (It was noted sandbags are not favoured; other more efficient products were now available).
- **6. County Councillors Report:** Cllr Denton reported that Parkgate Lane was due to be inspected following last week's flooding but it was unlikely any work would be done on it until Somerset's new contractors started in April.

#### 7. Highways issues:

- i. Street Lights Turn off: No further comments had been received following publication of the questionnaire results in The Link. It was therefore agreed to approach Somerset to action turning off the agreed street lights after midnight by fitting new timing devices. Should crime rise this would be reviewed.
- ii. SIDs: The AutoSpeedWatch devices would be ordered by the Clerk.
- **iii. TRO for 20mph limit:** There had been no comments regarding the new speed limits in the village and along the A361. Somerset Highways will now put a schedule of work to action this in the next financial year, starting in April. The subject of village gates was discussed but with Autograph Homes no longer paying for these it would be up to the Parish Council to fund them.

#### 8. Planning:

#### i) New applications:

**2024/0108/TCA:** To prune magnolia – 9 High Street. No objections.

**2024/0172/CLE:** Application for an existing lawful development certificate for Residential Use Class C<sub>3</sub> – Barn at Monks Lake Farm, Monkley Lane. Noted.

**2024/0244/TCA:** Sorbus tree – 0.5-1m reduction all round, Grafted Maple – reduce crown by 1-1.5m, Apple and Pear – thin crowns by 10% and reduce by 1-1.5m, Birch remove all deadwood and reduce crown by 1-2m – The Stables, Langham Place. No objections.

#### ii) Somerset decisions:

None

**9. Solar Farm:** Application 2023/2183/FUL to build solar farm on land south and east of Bradford Road still had to be decided by Somerset. The CPRE had approached a Parish Councillor to request the Parish Council (PC) make further comment over the revised plans submitted by Low Carbon as the CPRE strongly felt these did not address any objections raised. Discussions on this agreed that

no further comment should be made as the current PC objections were sufficient. It was also noted that the determination date for Somerset was today so any comment could be too late.

Concerns were expressed that Low Carbon had not demonstrated that it had looked at alternative sites for this solar farm.

It was agreed that the PC had no objections to Low Carbon either attending the March meeting or conducting a 'Zoom session' with the PC.

A question over why Somerset's solar farm policy for the county had not been published and it was agreed to investigate when this will be published as it is considered important with regard to any solar farm developments.

- 10. Ultrafast broadband: Information had been received from Gigaclear that the cabinet should go live in March and connections should be completed in May. However, it was noted that the work in the High Street had not been completed due to too many other services being in the way of the Gigaclear cabling and this had to be resolved.
- **11. LCN:** Previously reported above. However, Cllr Denton said that Somerset would be contacting the PC to get a form completed to assess the Council's priorities.

#### 12. Financial matters:

- **i. Annual finances:** The Clerk reported that after 10 months the PC was showing a profit for the year and should show a surplus for the year as there were no major costs envisaged for the next 2 months.
- **ii. Assets:** The asset register was noted. The Clerk was asked to cost new waste bin for The Shard.

iii. Payments: The following payments were agreed:






